PUBLIC COMMENT – AGENDIZED ITEMS

Speaker or topic	Notes captured
Joaquin BLVD Association Ambassador	• They have been noticing an increasing amount of younger people. • There has been an increasing amount of overdosing and dehydration throughout the BLVD. They believe the dehydration is because of the weather change. They also believe the weather warming up is causing the uptake in disturbances. They are coming across more homeless encampments; there is one at Residents Inn and at Burns Pharmacy. • There is a man known on the BLVD because he exposes himself. • Ambassador mentioned that he and his team encourage businesses and the community to report to LPD. • Arco had another window break; Modern Tea barricades their windows. • Ambassadors mention that his team has been proactive in deescalating situations without involving LPD, they have been working on mental wellness checks. • Ambassadors have also been on top of graffiti. • Joaquin mentioned that there have been damaged radios and floor speakers. • Michael asked Joaquin for for a monthly staff report of damages. Joaquin mentioned that they have been sending them to PARC to which Michael asked to be CC'd on those emails so that he can be looped n. • Joaquin was also asked for an hourly breakdown so that everyone is informed on what is happening day and night at the blvd. • It was mentioned that Monday – Wednesday there is more crimes, more police is medical is needed than Thursday- Sunday.
Rochelle (LPD)	• She encourages everyone to take pictures & videos of all things happening as well as reporting. All this information goes into a data base and can help identify patterns.

	• Radios weren't approved for ambassadors. Looking to get contact s.o.s for the team. • LPD has added three homeless teams to help. • She mentioned that LPD, Code Enforcement and ambassadors have been working as a team. • LPD doesn't have foot patrol, hey don't have enough staff. They only respond to calls. • They encourage business owners to go to business watch meeting to speak to PD • PD has been getting overnigher out of the BLVD in the mornings. • There will be an operation at the bowling alley next week (maybe Thursday) they will be putting fencing up. • May 30 there will be a pride walk. There will be 30-40 ppl. They were verbally assaulted last year. Joaquin asked PD for presence, but they suggested to have the organizer of the walk to be proactive and to reach out to PD themselves.
Lonyei (Serenity Village)	• Mental Health First Aid—Anyone who is forward facing should be aware of mental health • Serenity Village –10 yea anniversary she brough bags to gift during her presentation. • May 28 they will be “activating” the BLVD with mental health education. • Will be having a scavenger hunt on the BLVD. • Asked for donations for gift baskets • Is involved in face-to-face marketing/networking
Kevin Reyes (Children's Center)	• Kevin attended the meeting to inform the community of their organization and hat they provide for young adult ages 15-25yrs. They offer basic needs care, meals, case management, recreational services, car repairs. • They will be hosting a Mixer June 10th for business owners to be familiar with their building.
